#### Wildwood Green Adopt-A-Hole Program – 2014 and 2015

MGA, EMC League, Pratto League, Wild Working Women, WildOats, Wildflowers, Gaggle, Women on Wednesdays,

The purpose of the program is to help upkeep with each hole at Wildwood Green. Member groups and leagues are asked to take extra pride over the holes assigned below but to also help throughout their round on other holes in need. Holes are divided out amongst member leagues and members of these groups are requested to help maintain the appearance and upkeep, report any problems or areas of attention to the Golf Shop, rake bunkers, pick up trash, fill divots with sand and repair ball marks.

- Sanding Divots: Sand your divot plus all others within a six foot radius of yours. Be sure to flatten the sand out with your foot.
- Raking Bunkers: Whenever passing a bunker be sure to rake what you can. If you have finished a hole early and You are waiting for your partner to finish you should rake green side bunkers being sure to place rake on the inside edge of the bunker (off the grass and in the sand).
- Fixing Pitch Marks: Fix yours plus two more while on the green. You should always flatten the mark out first with your putter and place the repair tool behind the highest point of the mark. Always push in towards the middle from the top...never up from underneath the mark.
- Cleaning Tees and Filling Divots on Tee Boxes: Any time you are on a tee box pick up broken tees and place them into the square tee collector at each tee marker. If there is no tee collector please notify the golf shop after play. When teeing off on a par three be sure to fill divots in using the sand provided at each tee marker. This is as important, if not more than divots in the fairway being filled.
- Reporting Maintenance Needs: Record any information needed with your name and phone number and report it immediately to the Golf Shop following your round. If time does not permit stopping by the Golf Shop fill out a comment card and be as specific as possible. Please leave contact information so we can contact you with any questions!



#### Rule of the Month

#### Rule: 27-2 Provisional Ball

**Question:** If I hit my tee shot and I don't know if the ball went out of bounds, am I allowed to hit another ball with no penalty?

#### Answer:

**A.** The player must inform his opponent that he intends to play a provisional ball before anyone searches for the original ball.

**B.** The player may play the provisional ball until he reaches the place where the original ball may likely be. The provisional ball becomes the ball in play when the original ball is deemed lost under penalty of a stroke.

**C.** If the original ball is found, the strokes with the provisional ball are invoked and the penalties are disregarded.

"TopGolf Entertainment Center Eyes Cary Towne Center Site"

CARY — TopGolf, a Texas-based company that builds elaborate driving range/restaurant complexes, is interested in opening a facility at the space Sears will soon vacate at Cary Towne Center, according to Cary town staff and a TopGolf spokeswoman.

Sears, a longtime tenant of the mall, announced in October that it would close the Cary store after the holiday season. The closing, which affects 66 employees, is scheduled for Jan. 18, a Sears spokesman said on Thursday.

To make way for the complex, the Sears building likely would be demolished and the property would need to be rezoned to build TopGolf's standard three-story, 65,000-square-foot facility that includes a driving range, restaurant, bar and lounge. Town rules limit buildings at Cary Towne Center to two stories.

TopGolf representatives will host a meeting at the mall Monday from 6:30 to 7:30 p.m. to talk to select Cary property owners about the company's ideas for the Sears space. The meeting is one of the first steps in the rezoning process, said Dan Matthys, a development liaison for the town of Cary, on Thursday. A concept plan for the TopGolf facility also calls for rerouting some of the small roads around the mall, Matthys said. "There's definitely some zoning hurdles they'll have to overcome," he said. TopGolf, founded in 2000, attempts to appeal to golfers and non-golfers by making a game out of the driving range. Customers can hit micro chipped balls at modernized greens in the outfield that track where a ball lands. Each shot is recorded and posted on a monitor. TopGolf's website describes the setup as an "outdoor dartboard, but for golf."

The company has 10 locations in the United States and three in the United Kingdom, with none in North Carolina. TopGolf plans to open two more complexes by the end of the year and 11 more by the end of next year, said Adrienne Chance, senior communications manager for TopGolf.

Each facility employs more than 450 people, of which 150 work full-time, Chance said. TopGolf hopes North

Carolina will be home to one of the 49 locations it hopes to open by the end of 2017, she said.

"It has a great climate and great golfing community," she said. "We're looking at (the Sears site), and we're very interested."

TopGolf representatives met with Cary staff Nov. 26 to talk about the potential for building on 15 acres near where the Sears store currently sits, Matthys said. TopGolf is the only company that has expressed interest in the site to Cary staff, he said.

A spokesman for CBL & Associates Properties, which manages Cary Towne Center, didn't immediately return requests for comment on Thursday.

"CBL has a long track record of successfully replacing or redeveloping anchor locations that has resulted in a win-win for the consumer and our mall properties," Dan Summerlin, director of corporate relations for CBL, wrote in an earlier email. Cary Towne Center is not the only mall Sears is leaving in an attempt to reduce ongoing expenses. Sears plans to close, or already has closed, six other stores at malls operated by CBL, Summerlin said. The Sears store in Cary Towne Center is in one of the only anchor spaces that's not visible from any of the three surrounding roads: Walnut Street, Maynard Road and Cary Towne Boulevard.

This week, a row of signs advertising Sears' liquidation sale leads shoppers through the mall streets to the store. Many shoppers have found their way to Sears and picked through many of the store's giftable items by Thursday.

On a recent morning, associates were dismantling hangers and racks in the boy's clothing section. Empty hooks outnumbered pocket knives and hand tools down one aisle. And in women's accessories, a lone purse hung from a 12-foot rack on the wall. Cary Towne Center is currently 95 percent occupied, Summerlin said, including seasonal tenants. TopGolf would compete with Dave & Buster's, a 29,900-square-foot entertainment complex that opened at Cary Towne Center in November 2013.
