The cool season greens as well as the over seeded areas here at Wildwood benefit from the below normal weather we have been having this spring. Alternatively, warm season grasses have struggled to come out of dormancy and in some cases have not survived according to a recent alert from NCSU turf files. Ground temperatures began to warm in early March. Toward the end of March there was a freeze that resulted in slow spring green up or death. North facing slopes that are shaded and collars have been affected most. We have a few areas here at Wildwood that were damaged and we will begin repairing immediately. Some other projects that we have been focusing on and will continue to improve have been bunkers and irrigation. Over 26 tons of sand have been added to bunkers to correct depths. There were 48 irrigation heads installed in April to have more adequate coverage to greens. I would like to thank everyone for the positive comments and encourage everyone to fill out comment cards. This past month has been such a turn around from the cold winter we had! We have had some really great temperatures and plenty of rain to help out the course. The color has popped significantly and green grass is peaking through nearly everywhere!

On Friday, May 1st (the Friday of Member-Member weekend) we will host a FREE information night and member social. This event will feature free appetizers and drinks and is open to all members of Wildwood Green! Please RSVP to the golf shop so we know how much food and drink to prepare for. We will have each member committee on hand to answer any questions you may have. Lastly, as you may have seen, we have **added a new set of tees** between the forward (pink) and middle (gold) set of tees. These tees will help bridge the yardage gap between the current two most forward sets and will be officially rated for men and women. We have also recently had the other sets of tees officially rated by the CGA. This process happens once every 7-10 years and the **GHIN handicapping system now reflects these new ratings**. If you post your scores using your smartphone app or on your computer and have Wildwood Green saved as a favorite, you will need to **re-add our course** to your favorites for the new ratings to take effect. To re-add our course please delete Wildwood Green off of your current favorites list and then re-search for our course through the marketplace. **Once Wildwood Green has been found, re-save it as a favorite and your updates should be complete**! As a reminder, we also have our family golf tees officially rated by the CGA. These sets of tees are typically located around the 200 yard marker in each fairway. We do have family tee scorecards at the golf shop counter for you to use and enjoy!

Match Schedule

Matches will take place each Monday evening and tee times will begin at 5:00 pm and will run through 5:45 pm. The season will start on June 1 and finish on August 31. If there is a week that is rained out we will use the month of September for makeup dates. The season will run for a total of 14 weeks. Please email jeff@wildwoodgreen.com with any tee time requests and days you will be unable to play from week to week. In the event that your opponent will be unable to play you will be paired with someone in your flight whenever possible to avoid playing par. We will cycle through the pairings rotation and stay in order through week 14. We will have a year-end skins event on October 3 which is included in the \$30 entry (\$10 of which goes to the skins game per person, \$12 of which goes towards prizes weekly and \$8 of which goes towards lunch on the year-end event).

Flighting Information and Prizes

Flights will be determined by the number of people signed up and then divided by handicap index to create as even as possible flights. The flights will then be loaded into a round robin generator and the matches will be set. The same rotation will be followed throughout the season, however if someone is unable to attend a week, competitors will be paired together to avoid playing "par". Each week closest to the pin competitions will be held on each par 3. Prizes will vary from week to week.

Format and Scoring

The league is a match play format and there are a possible ten points each week. One point is awarded for winning a hole and one point is also awarded for winning the match. If the match is halved the extra point is also halved. A running total will be kept throughout the year and the winner of each flight will be determined by the point totals. **Your best nine point totals will count in the final scoring**.

Flight Results

Flight results will be kept in the weekly member email that is sent out each Sunday morning (depending on our event schedule). Please return all scorecards to the Golf Shop following play so that accurate records can be kept. The last group is asked to please pick up the closest to the pin markers so that prizes can be handed out each evening following play.

 - •_Place rakes back in the bunkers when you finish raking the sand
 - •Do not discard your cigarette butts on the ground. Don't cause fires! Pick up your butts and discard them in the trash.
- Please check in at the golf shop counter every time before your round
 When walking with a push cart please respect the roped off areas around the green. Keep your push cart off the green and fringe.

• Keep up with the Pace of Play and the group in front of you. Follow the on in one out rule (drive to the next tee to put your putter away), play a more forward set of tees that suits your skill level and plan your shot before reaching your ball by playing ready golf.

Rule of the Month

Rule: Repairing the Line of your Putt

Question: Am I allowed to fix marks on the green that could affect the path of my putt?

Answer:

A. You may repair any ball marks in your line and removed any pebbles or foreign objects in your line, provided you do it with your hand or club.

B. You may not fix spike marks or fan the ground with a towel or cap to remove sand or foreign objects.

C. The penalty for doing so is loss of hole in match play or a 2 shot penalty in stroke play.

Jordan Spieth's biggest prize for winning the Masters — telling his sister he won By Eric Adelsen April 12, 2015 10:16 PMYahoo Sports

AUGUSTA — Of all the wonders and joys that will come with winning the Masters, perhaps the best for Jordan Spieth will be telling his sister, Ellie.

The golf world has marveled all week at Spieth's poise, his perspective, his whole persona, and a lot of that comes from being around Ellie, who is 14. She is a special-needs child, and her journey has served as a touchstone for her older brother's life. "She's the funniest member of our family," Jordan said. "It's humbling to see her and her friends and the struggles they go through each day that we take for granted — their kind of lack of patience or understanding, where it seems easy for us and it's not for them." When she came to see her brother play in person for the first time last week in Houston, Ellie kept asking Jordan after every round: "Did you win? Did you win?"

And Jordan said, "Not yet." And then, "Not yet." And then finally, "No."

"I can tell her I won now," he said Sunday with a grin.

He won in a commanding, stunning, historic way: becoming the first player in Masters history to get to 19-under par before finishing at the same record 18-under par Tiger Woods posted in 1997. And while the statistics and numbers of his victory will be discussed for ages, the real victory is the one Ellie can feel. It's the blessing of seeing her brother happy.

Spieth said he felt a rush of joy seeing his parents and brother waiting for him behind the 18th green — the first time they have seen him win a tournament as a professional — and when he was asked what the feeling might be like for Ellie watching on TV, he mentioned the excitement she would sense when she saw the family together. "Being Ellie's brother," Spieth wrote on his website, "humbles me every day of my life."

It's not that Spieth doesn't care about running roughshod over the course and the competition. He texted caddie Michael Greller on Sunday morning and said he wanted to get to 20-under par. Considering, at that moment, no one had ever gotten to 19-under par, that was quite the aggressive plan.

But behind that ambition is something else, perhaps best explained through another conversation Spieth had Sunday morning. His dad, Shawn, didn't say anything to his son before last year's final round, but this time he did.

"This is the greatest game, the Masters," Shawn Spieth said. "But it's still a game."

That's the perspective that Jordan Spieth seems to take with him everywhere. His younger brother Steven is not a golfer but a basketball player for Brown. Most of his closest friends don't play golf. Even Jordan himself grew up playing several sports. There's a bigger world out there, and Jordan understands it. Even caddie Michael Greller said Saturday that "at the end of the day, golf is just entertainment." And when Jordan got up to accept the green jacket, the moment every golfer cherishes as a distant ideal, he began by thanking the club members, the volunteers, and the food and beverage staff.

He then called winning The Masters "the ultimate goal in my life" before correcting himself: "my golf life." So although Spieth reveres golf history, relying on Ben Crenshaw and caddie Carl Jackson <u>to prepare him for this week's tournament</u>, he is not a golf geek. He grew up doing much more than beating balls into nets endlessly like some fast-track kids. That, too, helped him this week. He said he relied chiefly on his imagination during the tournament, leaning on his ability to see arcs and curves and slopes. To many pros, the undulations of Augusta National serve as a house of horrors, keeping every setup from stability. Spieth loves that — loves the fact that every swing and putt is a little off-kilter. He sees the bigger picture even inside the tiniest frame. "He's got great feel and instincts," Grellar said Sunday. "Carl [Jackson] told me to trust our instincts, so 1 just tried to stay out of his way."

Perhaps what's most remarkable about Spieth's record performance at the Masters — he's the first wire-to-wire winner since 1976 — is that he's not an especially long hitter. He doesn't crush the ball like Rory McIlroy or Tiger or Dustin Johnson. He doesn't elicit gasps when he swings or chills when the ball rockets off his clubface. "I'll never hit it as far as [Rory] does," Spieth said. "I have to make it up someplace else."

That someplace else was everywhere this week at Augusta. He was so brilliantly unspectacular that when he lined up his putt on the 12th green at Amen Corner on Sunday, fans were walking away by the dozen, moving to the next hole. That nook of the golf universe is known for its drama — literally named because of the need for divine help — and Spieth leaked that drama like a party balloon. He was basically a stealth supernova.

His stealth days are over now. He will be on the monument of tour record-holders out by the 18th tee, with names like Woods, Mickelson, Nicklaus, Casper and Palmer. Woods' heretofore unthinkable 1997 tournament is now matched: Spieth has made the incomparable comparable.

But all that is for the rest of us to ponder and debate. The real reward comes when Jordan Spieth sees his little sister and she asks him, "Did you win?"The answer will be yes, and the moment of triumph will truly be shared.
