We have another member event of this month on **March 16th.** There is room for 120 players so be sure to register early for it! The format is **a 4 Player Texas Scramble**, where all four players will tee off, the team will select their best tee shot, and each player will play their own ball for the rest of the hole from that spot. The game is Count 2 Net, you can signup as a single, twosome, threesome, or a full team and we will take care of the rest!

Be sure to sign up for the **monthly medalist game on March 17th**. Limited space remaining. Cost is **\$20** cash due on the day of play.

Friday-Sunday shotguns will continue until the time change in March which is at **2:00 AM on the morning of March 10th.** After that, we will switch back and host tee times each day of the week. Meaning March 9th is a shotgun but March 10th and the rest of March will be tee times beginning at 8:30 AM.

Our range hours will change this month. From March 1st—March 9th Our last bucket of balls will be sold at 5:30 PM Monday-Saturday and at 3:30 PM on Sunday. **From March 10th—March 31st** Our last bucket of balls will be sold at 6:00 PM Monday-Saturday and at 4:00 PM on Sunday. The driving range will have a hard closing time of 30 minutes AFTER the last bucket is sold. Sundays we perform a clean pick of the range so we appreciate your understanding of the earlier closing time.

I am writing this in an effort to help inform the membership on what High School and University play will look like this Spring. Wildwood has a rich history of junior success and it is always a priority of the management and ownership to give juniors every opportunity possible to succeed through using Wildwood and its facilities. That being said, we all know how busy it can get some days out here and adding high school teams or university teams doesn't always help that cause. This year we have consolidated our high school and university play/practice to specific days and times of the week as to interfere with member play as little as possible. This spring, Wildwood Green will be the home course for Meredith University, Sanderson High School, Ravenscroft High School, Trinity Academy, and Raleigh Charter Academy. That is four less schools than in 2023 and we declined another seven schools who requested access to our facilities in 2024. High School and University play will mainly take place on Tuesday's and Thursday's from 3:00-4:30. It is our intention to keep them consolidated to those time periods and not take away range spots, putting green spots, or tee times during those prime after work hours (4:30pm-6:30pm during the season). There will be no high school play on Friday, Saturday, or Sunday. Meredith University will have limited access on Saturday afternoons. Monday's and Wednesday's will see very little high school play and practice. All coaches and players have been informed of our pace of play policies and informed that repeat offences may lead to the team be pulled off the course, even in a match. All coaches and players have also been informed to limit their usage of the practice facilities as to not interfere with members doing the same. Meaning we want a team of 6-8 players to use 2-3 spots on the driving range or 1-2 cups on the putting green instead of everyone spreading out and taking their own station, limiting the members from having proper access. Superintendent – Rick Durham

After a warm, wet February, March has a forecast of above average temperatures. With the warmer temperatures we have had to move agronomic applications to earlier dates than planned. The golf course has been pre emerged for summer annual weeds. This application will prevent weeds such as crabgrass and goosegrass from germinating. Once germinated these weeds can be difficult to control and it is always better to prevent them from showing up. A follow up application later in the spring could be applied to help aide control through the long sizzling summer. Greens have woken up a little and mowing has become more consistent. We will however leave the greens covers out through March just in case there is a significant dip in temperatures. We have exceeded our bunker renovation total and only have five bunkers to do. Number seven, eight, nine and eleven will be completed late summer or early fall. Please keep in mind that with new sand it will take time to settle and pack down. Entry into the new bunkers should be done on the lower side. With have purchased new sand trap rakes with stickers that read leave rakes in bunkers. Minimal maintenance landscaping is being planted using different varieties of ornamental grasses. These ornamentals will provide stabilization to areas we have had trouble growing turf due to water and traffic issues. Different varieties have been chosen that produce aesthetic colors during the growing season. The project that we currently have going on is clearing the right side of number nine. Nine trees have been removed and we will be grading the area and sodding. This has opened the right side up and will help with playability and pace of play. 

The cost is \$10 per member, regardless of category type and you will not be charged additional fees for playing outside of your categories restrictions. The structure will be a max of 128 golfers in 16-32 different pods. There 4 or 5 players per pod and the winner of each pod will move on to the single elimination portion of the tournament. The single elimination portion will be a 32 player bracket consisting of all pod winners and **wildcards** if necessary. You will be assured 3 matches and there is one round of matches per month. Wildwood Green Frost Delay Policy:

When the overnight temperature drops below freezing, there is a potential for a frost delay. If there is frost on the course the Superintendent will let the Golf Shop know what the revised starting time for the day will be as quickly as

possible, and we will inform you of any updates via E-Communication.

Once the Superintendent gives the Golf Shop the "all clear" to begin play, we will implement a forward shotgun for all play at and before the new starting time. We have a 45-minute minimum notification time, so if we get the goahead to open the course at 9:00am, the shotgun will begin at 9:45am to allow golfers time to get to the course.

Things to Keep in Mind:

• If frost on the course is ignored and regular play commences it will cause damage to the playing surface and make the grass susceptible to disease and weeds.

• Frost Delays also apply to the practice greens. We don't want to damage those!
