2026 Member Introduction

Over the last several years, Wildwood Green has continued to grow, improve, and invest in our facilities—and 2026 is set to be one of our best years yet.

Since 2017, more than \$3 million has been reinvested into the club. A major highlight was converting our greens from bent grass to Champion Ultra Dwarf Bermuda, which continues to provide excellent conditions. Roof replacements were completed on the range building, on-course restroom, and pump house on hole #6. The clubhouse saw new windows and front doors installed, followed by a complete interior remodel of the golf shop and Champions Grille in 2019. Additional enhancements included repairing steps, restriping the parking lot, adding a patio awning, and enclosing the pavilion. To improve turf health, over 350 trees were removed, and irrigation upgrades were made across the property—our tees, greens, and fairways are now fully automated. Practice facilities were also refreshed with a new putting green, improved mats, bag stands, targets, and balls, plus updated landscaping and a renovated bag drop area featuring a new flagpole.

In the years following, we kept moving forward. Cart paths were repaired, new railroad ties and curbing were installed, and more landscaping and irrigation upgrades were completed. We cleaned the pond by #5 green and lake on #12, enlarged the forward tee on #12, expanded the lesson tee, installed nets between the range and hole #1, developed a new scorecard, and added taller range nets along Strickland Road. The fairway bunker on #1 was removed, and more hitting space was created at the lesson tee.

Most recently, we completed bunker renovations (2024–2025), added benches across the course, refined cart path edges, and continued mass tree and limb removal. Looking ahead to 2026, plans include renovating select tee boxes, continuing our tree work, and beginning on a pavilion restroom addition. After nearly a decade of steady progress, the stage is set for one of our most exciting years yet.

Our events calendar is filled with opportunities to play and connect with fellow members, including the Masters Par 3, three Couples Events, PGA Major Championship Pools, SWAT and Medalist Games, and our signature annual tournaments. These events continue to be a highlight of our community and a chance to bring members together in both fun and competitive settings.

In 2026, we'll be introducing two new events—one in January and one in July—while also refreshing some of our long-standing traditions. The Ryder Cup–style event will now be called the *Watson Cup*, the Spring Member-Member will be the *Dogwood*, and the Fall Member-Member will be the *Oaks*. Our goal each year is to find the right combination of new formats and familiar favorites, so the schedule remains fresh, fun, and enjoyable for all members. By mixing in creative twists with proven traditions, we can continue building a calendar that grows stronger from year to year.

W.G.G.C Points System

We will be implementing the same point system for our events as last year. The purpose of this system is to give people who participate in Wildwood events an advantage when it comes to Member-Guest sign-ups. 70% of the Member Guest Field will be decided this way, the other 30% of the field will be selected via a non-weighted, equal value lottery. For the weighted lottery, each kind of event will be given a point value. The points are not based on performance in the event but participation in the event. This system will run from the first event after the 2024 Member-Guest until the event before the 2025 Member-Guest. Each point will put your name into the hat for Member-Guest. (If you get 10 points your name will be in the hat 10 times)

Tournament Information, **Flighting Information, & Regulations**

Wildwood Green WILL post scores for events that are post-able rounds.

Competition Tees: Each competitor's **set of tees** to be played will be assigned to the competitor based on the set of tees most commonly played from in their most recent handicap revision. In the event other courses have been played, the staff will assign a tee based on the other course's rating closest to that of a set of tees at Wildwood Green.

Event Flighting: Events will be flighted in the Spring & Fall Member-Member events, and then for the Club Championship we will flight after the first day. For other club events, flights will depend on field size. When there are 15 or more teams or 30+ competitors, flights will be created and broken down as evenly as possible.

Flight Basis: When playing your own ball, flights will be determined by the low handicap index of the two/four-player team according to the most recent GHIN revision, either the 1st or the 15th of the month. War in the Woods Member Guest will use 12-month low indexes.

Handicap Indexes: The handicap index used for the event competitor will be the handicap index of each person on the day of the event signup deadline.

Handicap Allowances: *Please see the attached Appendix C document from the USGA regarding handicap allowances*

During **match play events**, each competitor will receive 100% of their course handicap and then the low course handicap will play as a **zero** and the higher course handicap will receive the difference in strokes.



Handicap Allowances

Handicap allowances are designed to provide equity for players of all levels of ability in each format of play over both 9 holes and 18 holes. *Handicap allowances* are applied to the *Course Handicap* as the final step in calculating a player's *Playing Handicap* (see Rule 6.1 Course Handicap Calculation and Rule 6.2 Playing Handicap Calculation).

The National Association is responsible for establishing *handicap allowances* or it can delegate this responsibility to a Regional Golf Association or *golf club*.

The following table sets out the recommended *handicap allowances* based on medium-sized field net events. The allowances may be adjusted based on field size and the desired equity (see Interpretation C/1):

Unless otherwise specified by the Committee, players with a 'plus' Playing Handicap give strokes back to the course, beginning at the hole with stroke index 18. For example, a player with a Playing Handicap of +2 would give strokes back to the course at the holes with stroke index 18 and 17. When handicap allowances are applied, a player with a plus Playing Handicap moves up towards zero including rounding. This is to maintain the same relative difference between Playing Handicaps.



Wildwood Green - Local Rules



Specific Notes – Front Nine

Hole #1: The driving range is considered out of bounds. White PVC pipe defines the out of bounds along the nets.

Hole #2: Out of bounds runs the entire right-hand side of the hole and is marked with white stakes or white PVC pipe. When the creek(s) meets out of bounds, two stakes will be present. When there are two stakes present, both white and red, the line from red stake to red stake will define the end of the penalty area.

Hole #3: Out of bounds runs the entire right-hand side of the hole meeting a penalty area that begins at the back-right hand corner of the hole behind the green. The penalty area extends into the woods towards #5 green and to the left towards #4 tee. When the penalty area meets out of bounds, two stakes will be present. When there are two stakes present, both white and red, the line from red stake to red stake will define the end of the penalty area.

Hole #5: Penalty area begins near the tee and runs the length of the entire right side of the fairway and connects to out of bounds that starts at the green on the right side. The drain in-between #5 fairway and #13 fairway is deemed as ground under repair.

Hole #6: Out of bounds extends up the entire right side of the hole and connects to out of bounds at the back right corner of the hole. Directly behind the green is out of bounds marked with white PVC pipe that runs the length of the road/#7. For any balls hit into the water, there are two drop zones provided, one to the left of the green and one to the right. You should use the drop zone furthest away from the flag for any balls hit into the water.

Hole #8: The trees to the left of the fairway are considered a penalty area and are marked with red stakes. Out of bounds extends the entire right-hand side of the hole.

Hole #9: The trees to the right of the fairway are marked as out of bounds and extend up the right side of the hole and then behind the green and then to the left toward the houses. The houses are marked as out of bounds as well.

Specific Notes – Back Nine

Hole #10: The drainage ditch in between the 10th and 18th hole is deemed ground under repair. The drain next to the cart path in the middle of the fairway near the edge of the water is deemed as ground under repair. The rocks near the cart path behind the green are marked as hazard .

Hole #11: Out of bounds runs the entire right side of the hole towards the back right corner near the green. The creek behind the green is marked as a penalty area. When there are two stakes present, both white and red, the line from white PVC pipe to white PVC pipe will define the end of the penalty area.

Hole #12: The creek directly behind the tee box is marked as a penalty area and will extend up the right-hand side of the tee box towards the green until a red/white stake combination is present. Out of bounds extends up the right-hand side of the hole through the woods toward hole #13. For any ball hit into the water, there are two drop zones provided, one in the front of the green and one behind the green. You should use the drop zone furthest away from the flag for any balls hit into the water.

Hole #13: The drain in between #13 fairway and #5 fairway is deemed as ground under repair. The grouping of trees on the left side roughly 50 yards from the green are marked as a penalty area.

Hole #14: The drain between #14 fairway and #15 tee box is deemed as ground under repair. The drainage ditch near the cart path on the right side of the hole (roughly 50 yards from the green) is deemed as ground under repair.

Hole #16: The drainage area to the left of the fairway in the trees is deemed as ground under repair.

Hole #18: The drain between the 10th and 18th fairways is deemed as ground under repair. The drainage ditch in between the 10th and 18th hole is deemed as ground under repair. The flower bed directly behind the green and to the left is a mandatory free drop.

Extra Local Rules Information

- Please do not probe for golf balls in our neighbor's yards and always respect their property.
- Out of Bounds is defined by white stakes, white PVC pipe, and by the inside edges of the street curb or the roads meandering through the neighborhood.
- Penalty areas are defined by red stakes and lines.
- Drop zones are provided on the following holes and are defined by white circles: #6 and #12. It is not mandatory to use a drop zone on either of these holes however, if the drop zone is not used, relief should be taken at the last point the golf ball entered the penalty area and/or by following all USGA guidelines.
- When a ball is hit into a mulched area it should be played as it lies. If the ball is in a maintained flower bed free relief is mandatory. Relief should be taken at the nearest point, no closer to the hole.

Any ball deemed to be lost or out of bounds may take stroke and distance relief or dropped on the edge of the fairway no closer to the hole with 2 penalty strokes (Local Rule E-5) **PLEASE NOTE: If a provisional ball is hit you will no longer be allowed to take the relief under Local Rule E-5.**

The driving range will follow a rotation between mats and grass, weather, and maintenance dependent. In March and November, there are two times listed to note before and after the time changes. From Thanksgiving until the time change in March, Friday-Sunday play starts as a 10:00 AM shotgun with room for 120 players. Normal tee times on those days resumes at 2:30 PM off #1 and #10.

2026 Major Events

The Dogwood-Spring Member-Member

Saturday, May 2nd – Sunday, May 3rd

Wildwood Green will kick off the 2026 Majors with the Spring Member-Member. This is a two-person team event with a format of one gross plus one net. Flights will be determined by the low player's 12-month low index. Teams can be made up of either men or women or a mixture of both. Course handicaps will be calculated based on the tee color played by each golfer. To accompany the championship matches there will be an optional team skins game and hat pool offered for the weekend. This first Major of the year is always a great value as the event features two days of competition. Be sure not to miss out on this exciting team competition and mark the date on your calendar now!

War in the Woods

Friday, June 5th - Sunday, June 7th

Wildwood Green's Member-Guest saw a major renovation during 2022 and received the upmost praise for its value and enjoyability. A tournament focused on providing value and creating one of the most action-packed weekends of the year. This event consists of 60 two-person teams who compete in a flighted round-robin match play competition playing 45 holes over the course of two days. With a practice round, Calcutta, raffle, prizes, and special contests, this tournament is the place to be on June 5th -June 7th!

Club Championship

Saturday, August 8th & Sunday, August 9th

The most prestigious title at Wildwood Green must be the title of Club Champion. This two-day stroke play competition, which hosts the club's best golfers, will undoubtedly see great scores again in 2026. The Club Championship will be flighted by age and then by handicap. Flight size is solely dependent on how many people sign up in the age division and will be flighted after the first day. No handicap will be used in competition and men and women will compete in separate flights.

We will also host a net division Club Championship and anyone who has a GHIN handicap is allowed to compete in the net division. The men's net division will not be broken down into flights, and instead will be created with one flight. Everyone playing in the net division will use 95% percent of their course handicap based on their 12-month low. The difference in tee ratings will be factored into the handicaps. To be crowned the overall men's or women's champion, you **MUST PLAY** in the gross division, as we have no overall champion within the net division.

New in 2023, Wildwood Green added a **women's only net division** and any female who has a GHIN handicap is allowed to compete in the net division. The women's net division will be broken down into flights. The Women's Overall Division will be flighted as always. Women will not have to decide between one or the other, they can play in both.

Watson Cup Event

Saturday, September 19th – Sunday, September 20th

Once a year, we host a Ryder Cup style golf tournament. New to 2026 we will be renaming this event as the “Watson Cup”. This is a 36-hole match play event which features two days of competition. This event will consist of 4 different matches played throughout two days, and 4 separate 9-hole competitions occur with players accumulating points for their team by winning or tying their match. The team with the most points after the completion of the four matches wins! In 2026 we will have 2 captains picking pairings for their team for a true Ryder Cup experience. If there is enough interest expressed we will do a live pairing selection the Friday night before the 1st round. The goal for this live selection is to add excitement and allow for you to be around your team to know more teammates.

The Oaks-Fall Member-Member

Saturday, October 10th - Sunday, October 11th

Our highly anticipated and most popular event will be held in October. The format for the Fall Member-Member is five, nine-hole match play matches. There will be three matches played on Saturday and two matches played on Sunday. Teams can be made up of either men or women or a mixture of both. The two-person teams will be flighted according to the low player's 12-month low and each flight will have a max of 6, two person teams.

Each person will play their own ball for each hole. The lowest net score on each hole will win between the two teams. One point is available on each hole and one point for winning the match (10 points per nine holes). Holes may be halved, and a 9-hole match may end in a tie at 5 points for each team. The team with the most points after the five matches, from each flight, will compete in a sudden death playoff for the title of Overall Member-Member Champion. Also, just like the Spring Member-Member, we will offer a hat pool. Be sure to grab your partner and sign up early as this event always fills up quickly!



Carolinas Golf Association Events

The Carolinas are home to hundreds of golf tournaments each year that appeal to a wide range of skill levels. The CGA administers its own calendar of championships, considered one of the strongest tournament programs in the country, as well as USGA qualifiers for national events.

Whether you're a scratch golfer looking to qualify for the U.S. Open or Carolinas Amateur Championship, or a mid-level handicap wanting to participate in one of the CGA's individual or team events, there is an opportunity for you to play. These events are open to members of CGA Member Clubs who have up-to-date CGA/USGA handicap indexes.



The CGA annually conducts 48 championships and five team match competitions for men, women, juniors, and seniors. Please note that you are a member of the CGA with your paid GHIN handicap at Wildwood Green Golf Club.

The CGA conducts over 100 One-Day tournaments that are open to both men and women with a CGA membership and an up-to-date CGA/USGA handicap index from a CGA member club. In 2026, we plan to host the Jack Ratz Jr. Memorial, a CGA one-day event, and potentially a senior 4-ball event.

Match Play Championship

In 2026, we will be follow our 2025 Match Play Championship structure. The structure will be a multi-weekend event starting with 2 chances at an 18-hole qualifier on July 25th and then August 16th, where the top 64 players will advance to the main event. The tournament spans three weekends: the first on September 6th with two rounds of match play starting in the morning and an afternoon session, followed by the second weekend on October 17th with two more rounds to narrow the field. The final round, scheduled for later, will determine the champion. Spectators are welcome and encouraged, we will run food and beverage specials during the final match. Monthly Games

Monthly Medalist Game

The Monthly Medalist Game will be held once a month on Sunday mornings, with signups opening one month in advance. This gross-only stroke play event is designed for lower-handicap golfers or those seeking competitive-style golf. Tee times are reserved and assigned by the golf shop, ensuring normal play is not disrupted. The game accommodates 16 players across four tee times, with a \$20 entry fee (\$10 to skins, \$5 to the overall pot, and \$5 to the same tee box pot).

Monthly SWAT Game

New for 2026, the Monthly SWAT Game will take place on the same date as Monthly Skins Day Starting in March. Players are organized into four-person teams and compete in a “count 2” match play format against all other teams. While this is a gross-only event, indexes are used to balance teams. This event There will be a \$20 entry fee for each player. There will be payouts for the front nine, back nine and overall.

Monthly Skins Day

The Monthly Skins Day is open to all players with an active GHIN handicap. Participants need a tee time and at least one other player to attest to their score. Entry is \$20 cash, with \$10 going toward net skins and \$10 toward gross skins



50/50 Weekly Member Raffle

We will host a 50/50 weekly member raffle **to help raise money for capital improvements** around the Wildwood Green facility. Improvements will be determined from customer comment cards and what is feasible for the club to accomplish.

The drawing will occur at 4:00 PM each Friday throughout the year. There is one poker chip per membership in the bowl and each membership has been assigned a number which corresponds to what is written on the poker chip. Poker chips are placed into the bowl and a member will draw one chip from the bowl. **(Participants must pay their \$5 entry each week to be eligible to win.)** Each Friday when the chip is drawn, we will check the number on the chip and determine the corresponding membership. If the membership has paid their \$5 entry for that week, they win 50% of the pool. Each week Wildwood Green will take 50% of the entries and put into a capital dues improvement fund.



If the drawn membership did not pay their entry that week there is no winner, the money carries over to the next week. Members have the option to prepay their \$5 for as many weeks as they would like.

In 2019, we added benches throughout the course and installed an ice-water machine. In 2020, we purchased an additional ice-water machine for the halfway house. In 2021, we enhanced the patio and walkway near the driving range, added new bag stands, and placed cooler stands on the course. In 2022, we upgraded benches and completed a renovation of the bunkers on hole #15. In 2023, we renovated 25 additional bunkers on the golf course and practice facilities. In 2024, we continued bunker renovations, tree removal, and tee box improvements. In 2025, we upgraded the ice-water machine in Champion's Grille, upgraded range targets, mats, and bag stands along with all flagsticks around the practice facilities, renovated five more tee boxes, and advanced tree and limb removal efforts.

Looking ahead, the 2026–2027 WGGC Advisory Committee has been tasked with identifying small, 50/50-funded improvements to bring forward for consideration. Please visit our website to view and connect with any of our ten outstanding advisors.
